Foundation (2-0) vs. Game Breakers (1-0)

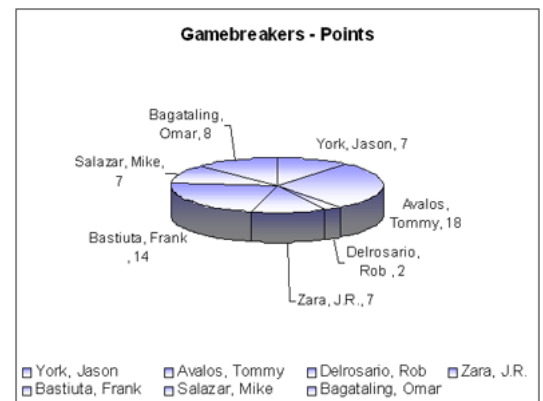
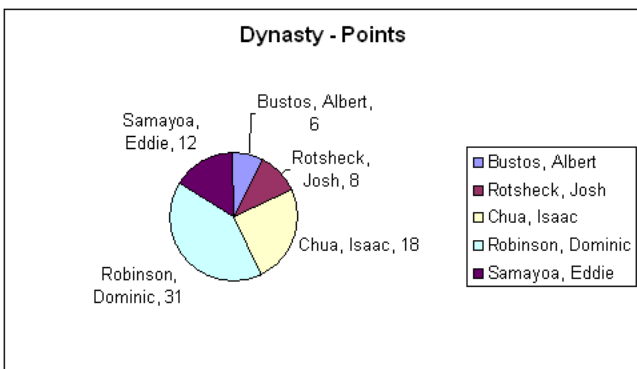

Foundation is playing with a lot of confidence after starting the season with two wins in a row. We will finally see how well they play defense as they play against one of the elite teams in the league. Game Breakers won their season opener and their strong showing impressed quite a few teams.

Three Foundation players are coming back from Hawaii, Havasu, Mexico. "Saturdays we party and have fun. On Sunday we run and gun." Collectively, the team have bought into the mantra of run and fun gun offense and are comfortable with having 2 viable point guards running the show. Brian Buenaventura is averaging 4.5 assists for the season and if the games were recorded, he would have at least 3 top ten plays. Lalo Arroyo has 2 double doubles for the season and he is looking on continuing that streak. He will have some help as Jon "Above the Rim, Mihm" Lee is revived after his vacation.

Game Breakers is led by Team Captain, Jason York. He is well scouted with three of the Foundation players playing with him on previous teams. "Normally he likes to shoot the rock from the outside and likes to shoot the ball every time but this Jason is a different dude. He is passing and rebounding, taking over games in a different way. His teammates must like this New York." Another player to watch out for is Frank Bastiuta (thats how his Team Captain spelled his last name) who scored 14 points in his debut. He can shoot from the outside and has a quick first step.

Notable Matchups: Alfred Flores vs. Tommy Avalos. Alfred Flores is averaging 24 ppg for the season. He can run all day and isn't restricted to just shooting the ball since he also plays defense. He is averaging 3.5 steals for the season. Tommy Avalos scored a game high 18 points in his debut. He has an all around game shooting 2 threes and swatting 1 shot. Look for Tommy to make like a Spaniard and run with the bulls.

Dynasty will finally play against a fundamentally sound team and we will finally realize how fluctuated their stats are after playing against some of the weaker teams in the league. Notable Matchups: Isaac Chua vs. Brian Lumbreras. Both are defense oriented PFs who can also score and pass. Dont underestimate Isaac, he looks big but boy can he run. Brian is the clear leader on this team and leads the team in most categories (13 ppg, 2 apg, 9rpg). Look for the middle to be crowded while the two big guys go at it.
